God's Kingdom: The Beauty of Diversity

Read Genesis 11:1-9 and then Acts 2:1-13

We're going to compare these two passages a little bit.

1. What contrasts or differences do you see between these two passages?
2. Why did God scramble the people of Babel?
3. Why did God let people speak in different languages in Acts?
4. Are there any similarities in these two passages?
5. Why would God do what he did in Babel, and then do what he did in Acts?

Read Revelation 7:9-10

6. Why wouldn't God just make all the nations speak one language and have one culture?
7. What are the benefits for multiculturalism?
8. Does being from a different culture affect how you interact or know God?
9. Can you still be united even though there are those differences? What unites Christians?

LEADER'S NOTES

These are some questions that relate to the message about the beauty of multiculturalism in God's church. I believe God is too big to be monopolised by one culture. And if only one culture owned God, then that would lead to horrible things like ethnic cleansing. Diversity allows different cultures to highlight different aspects of who God is, and what he is like, and then share that with one another.
