5. How can we who died to sin still live in it? What does Paul mean by that?
6. How can you consider yourself dead to sin? Would that change the way you live?
7. What does it mean to present yourself to God as an instrument of righteousness?
8. What does it mean that you are not under law, but under grace?
9. How should knowing all of this reflect in the way you live today, and how you interact with others?

These are questions that reflect the BASICS series in our church. These are suggested questions, that can hopefully provoke further discussion in your group.
