- 1. Why did Peter and John have boldness to proclaim Jesus?
- 1.1 What's the difference between the boldness Peter and John have, and your own situation? Do you lack boldness?
- 1.2 Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, launches into a defence of his actions, by preaching the gospel. What role does the Holy Spirit play in courage?
- 1.3 The NIV translates Acts 4:13 "When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus."
 - How much does your education and background give you courage? Is there a difference between courage and confidence? What gives Peter and John have the courage in this situation?
- 1.4 Read verse 18 How can this verse speak into your life?
